This fall has been a very active semester in regards to expansion. The Fraternity has been actively seeking new schools to expand to and restarting closed Chapters. The fall began with closed expansions at Seton Hall and Oakland University. The schools will be opening to structured expansions in the future, and we will continue to keep them on our radar.

Next, we have been confronted with opportunities at the University of West Virginia and Mount Saint Mary's in New York. Both schools were unsuccessful because of structured expansion or lack of staff to support a Chapter. Success has been achieved at a few old Chapters as we have seen interested men arise at three previously dormant Chapters. Interested men have approached the Fraternity at George Mason University, Longwood University and California University of Pennsylvania. These are schools we will be working with in the following semester to see about the possibility of reviving the closed Chapters on their campuses.

As far as new expansions, we have been successful in submitting expansion information to High Point University in North Carolina and will be submitting information to the University of Rochester in New York soon. Long term expansions at many schools have been highlighted and many of which are school we have previously had the Alpha Chi Rho flag at.
